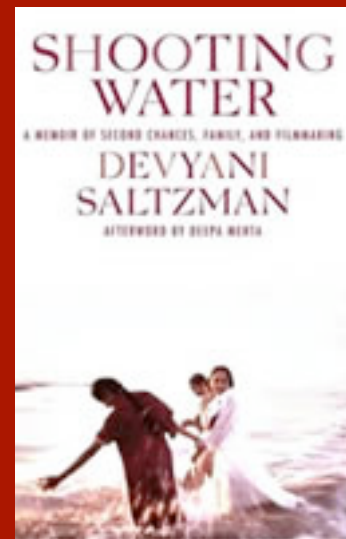

SHOOTING WATER: A MEMOIR OF SECOND CHANCES, FAMILY, & FILMMAKING: A TALK AND READING BY DEYYANI SALTZMAN

When Deyyani Saltzman was 19, her mother, filmmaker Deepa Mehta, invited her to India to begin production on Water, a film depicting the plight of Hindu widows. Both women were intent on repairing the rift that began when Deyyani's parents divorced years before. Deyyani has spent her life navigating two religions and two cultures; her new memoir chronicles the reconciliation that came about when mother and daughter confronted their shared past.
